

Clifford Township Supervisors Meeting June 14, 2016

Business meeting held on Tuesday June 14, 2016. Chairman Dennis Knowlton called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Motion to approve the minutes by Mr. Knowlton, second by Mr. Searle. All in favor. Treasurer's report reviewed and will be put on file. List of bills reviewed. Mr. Marcho made a motion to add a \$28.75 bill to the list to JHA. Seconded by Mr. Searle. All in favor. Mr. Searle made a motion to pay bills except Clifford Auto and Clifford Supply, seconded by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor. Mr. Searle made a motion to pay Clifford Auto and Clifford Supply, seconded by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor. Mr. Marcho abstained due to potential conflict of interest.

Old Business: Mr. Searle made a motion to purchase the Tell property of 7.39 acers for \$50,000.00 on the contingent that Mr. Knowlton will purchase the remaining two acers. Seconded by Mr. Marcho. All in favor. Mr. Knowlton abstained due to conflict of interest. All paper work for the Pettinato property is done and ready for signing.

New Business: Mr. Searle made a motion to grant permission to the Clifford Fire Co. to hold their annual picnic on July 28, 29 & 30th and to serve beer. Seconded by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor. Mr. Knowlton made a motion to allow the Clifford Fire police to help with the Greenfield Bicentennial Celebration and to preapprove the fire police to help with the Union Dale Fire picnic. Seconded by Mr. Searle. All in favor.

Road Report: Mr. Marcho reported that 99% of the road were done and 70% of the township roads had dust control done. The last road to be done is Stoney Lonesome by round pond. Work on Elk View Drive will start shortly after.

Planning Commission: Zoning meeting will be July 13th with Penn State Extension with an overview of zoning at 7:00 pm.

Fire Company: Mr. Phillips reported that the old rescue truck was sold to William Walker in Mayfield. The Kochmer Family donated a large piece of bluestone and Butch Coleman of Susquehanna has cut out firefighter in the stone to make a monument for display in front of the fire hall.
