January 3, 2006 was our re-organizational meeting. We would like to bid farewell to Adam Baron and thank him for his many years of hard work for the community and to welcome Dennis Knowlton as vice-chairman.

We are proud of the progress we are making towards the maintenance and improvement of township properties. The township applied for and received a \$20,000 grant for the men's and ladies' bathrooms in the township building. Under construction at this moment, they will be handicapped accessible and stateof-the art with automatic flush and water dispensers.

There is a new 40 foot by 90 foot equipment shed behind the township building. The need for this shed was two-fold: frozen equipment and vandalism. The building was placed over the old basketball court and later this year when more money is available, the floor will be concreted. State Aggregate has donated all of the stone placed in front of the building and Barhite Construction has moved the stone around, free of charge. Kozlowski Towing is donating all of the insulation. It is because of the generosity of our local businesses and the fiscal responsibility of the supervisors that this structure has been completely paid for without taking out a loan or increasing taxes.

Meet Your Neighbor, Adam Baron

Adam Baron was born on a farm in Pleasant Mount in 1923 and was one of nine children. As a young man he worked on the track crew for the railroad and helped out at a dairy owned

by a brother. For two years Adam worked in the Dickson mines, drilling and blasting. The mine eventually had to be shut down because of high gas concentration. This dangerous job became more so as the men robbed the coal pillars as they worked their way out for the final time; the



mine would cave in behind them. Employed by S. J. Groves Construction in the 1950s and 1960s, Adam went from truck driver to foreman. Finally, he moved to Clifford in 1965 when he bought the Spedding Hotel on Main Street. It was co-owned by Adam and his brother Charlie until Charlie's death in 1974 after which Adam and his wife Pauline ran Baron's Hotel until 1990. It was then sold and renamed the Clifford Hotel.

From 1990 through 1995 and 2000 through 2005, Adam was one of our township supervisors. Adam's passion was the maintenance of the township roads. He worked with a small crew with only a few pieces of equipment, but because of Adam's extensive construction background, was able to keep the many miles of dirt roads in good shape, year round. Adam has just finished his last term in office and plans to enjoy complete retirement with the companionship of his wife, two daughters and four grandchildren. He hopes to spend time hunting, fishing and catching up with home projects.

The community thanks Adam for his many years of selfless service. Pleased to meet you neighbor!

Trash Talk

The 2006 Pennsylvania Cleanup is scheduled for April. In conjunction with this, our township's roadside cleanup will begin on April 1 with gloves and bags available throughout the month at the Clifford Auto Center, Main Street.

Our township's fourth annual trash collection sponsored by the Clifford Township Community Alliance (CTCA) and the supervisors is scheduled for April 21 and 22 from 8 A.M. to **4:30 P.M.** at the township building. The township pays the costs in excess of what is charged as a community service to help keep our township clean. Offered to township residents only, proof of residence may be required. The fees are set to be affordable. Fees for large furniture and appliances range from \$6 to \$8. Items requiring special handling because of freon (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers) have a \$25 fee. There is no charge for window glass in boxes, bagged or bundled aluminum or paper. Large plastic items can be recycled including swing sets, picnic tables and slides. Cash or checks payable to "Clifford Township" are due at the time of drop-off. Unacceptable items are tires or rims, farm equipment or construction debris including vinyl siding. This project is another testament to the talent existing in all corners of Clifford Township. Clockwise, the first quadrant celebrates the dominance of farming from the earliest days until recently; the second refers to the natural beauty of the wooded mountains, lakes, the wildlife and stone walls; the third speaks of voluntarism exemplified by the Clifford Township Volunteer Fire Company; and the fourth represents the importance of the community, its churches, schools and homes.
