All surveys should be in by that date.

The Comprehensive Plan will guide the board on decisions for the next 15-30 years. If you're not involved, why not? If you don't want your neighbors deciding how the township will be in 2015, then get involved!

The Comprehensive Plan will also include a long term plan for the usage of the township property, such as the ball park, playground, Local History Museum, etc. Because of the many activities now conducted at the property, the supervisors support the idea of changing the name to the Clifford Township Community Center. A grant from the Visitors Bureau will help install new signs.

Loyal volunteers have made the township recycling program, held the third Saturday each month, possible. A few high school students will become involved for their senior projects. The supervisors are looking for someone to be in charge of the program. If recycling is your "thing" please consider this opportunity to help your township. The annual letter appeal you receive in the mail is the largest funding project the Fire Company conducts during the year. This appeal drive is a major contributor


