Clifford Township Supervisors

In the coming months, the Clifford Township Supervisors will focus on their priority of improving the quality of life for our citizens. We have just suffered through a harsh winter. However, our program of contracting for snow removal on township roads, rather than trying to handle them with our limited staff and equipment, has met with many compliments from our residents.

Now is the time for road maintenance and, to that end, we have budgeted money for our paved roads. The township does not have sufficient funds to completely resurface all the pavement in the township. However, we are consulting with experts from the Department of Transportation to find ways to improve the situation as much as possible with what funds we have.

We have also contracted to have our dirt roads and ditches improved over the summer. In response to comments from our residents concerning dust, we are planning to treat our roads in the spring and then, on the particularly difficult dust areas, place a second treatment in the summer. We also have identified a section of road to be treated with oil to study the feasibility.

In April, the Board of Supervisors approved an ordinance which established a Community Parks and Recreation Advisory Board. The CP&R board will be responsible for making recommendations and requesting grants for the improvement of the land around the community building. Eventually, we plan to have a basketball court area which could be flooded in winter and utilized as a skating area. In addition, we are in the initial stages of creating a walking track, fishing areas including a children's fish pond and a handicapped accessible fishing area, picnic areas, and year-round heated bathroom facilities, along with general purpose/soccer fields.

We will be conducting the Community Clean Up Day on Saturday, May 3, 9 am to 3 pm at the Community Center. Truck load is \$30, half load \$15. Large items are priced individually, see list at *cliffordtownship.com* or call 222-9364. Televisions and computers are free this year.

Bags, vests and gloves are available (for free) at Clifford Auto for volunteers to clear litter along township roads any day that suits your schedule. Filled bags will be picked up by the township. Please call 222-9364 with location of bags. There seems to be an increase in the quantity of trash along the roadsides. Cleaning up litter is a hard job. Please respect your neighbors and our beautiful township by helping to keep our roadsides free of trash.

In the near future, the property surrounding the ball field will need to be cleaned up (remove brush and pick up litter) in the first step toward improving our recreation area. Volunteers willing to help with this project should contact Chris Marcho at: chrismarcho@gmail.com. Your help would

stretch the dollars available to spend on this project, resulting in more improvements for all to enjoy.

The community building continues to be upgraded. Many of the improvements have been possible because the new windows and insulation have resulted in a huge savings on the heating bill.

We are in negotiations with the Montrose Adult Education program to offer classes on many subjects in our community building one or two days a week beginning in the fall. We are also in discussions with the Endless Mountains Visitors Bureau to see how we can best utilize the open rooms and property for the benefit of the township.

The Supervisors are working hard to be responsive to the citizens of our community and are focused on improving the quality of life here in Clifford Township. We thank you all for your support and patience.

Planning Commission of Clifford Township

The Clifford Township Planning Commission plays a major role in giving advice and providing recommendations to our Township Supervisors. Land use and land use planning are important issues at the local and state level. The Planning

Commission consists of members who are residents of the township and provide voluntary service to the community and, therefore, receive no compensation for their time and effort.

The Clifford Township Planning Commission meets monthly on the second Tuesday at 6:00 pm in the Community Center immediately prior to the Supervisors' meeting at 7:00 pm. Some of the issues coming before the Planning Commission this year includes requests for building setback waivers, property subdivisions and land use development.

A major effort for the planning commission during the last six months, in conjunction with the Advisory Committee for Clifford Township (ACCT), has been the development and approval of a Comprehensive Plan for the Township. A Comprehensive Plan is a tool for communities to use in guiding land use and planning community facilities and transportation. In brief, it serves as a policy guide, a source of information on the community, and a legal foundation for land use regulations. The Planning Commission has also been involved in the development and codification of two important components of the Comprehensive Plan: the township Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO) and the Building Setback Ordinance. All three of these important documents were accepted and approved by the Clifford Township Supervisors at meetings earlier this vear.

Clifford Township Historical Society

In cooperation with the Township Supervisors and with help from an Endless Mountains Heritage Region grant, the Society has remodeled the museum sections of the hallway at the Community Center. Ordie Price's Sawmill supplied butternut lumber at half price to cover 170 lineal feet of wainscoting. During March, seventeen volunteers worked for 226 hours cutting, planing, sanding and varnishing all the lumber. We are so grateful for these efforts because, besides making this project possible, their in-kind donated hours greatly helps the Society fulfill the match for the grant, saving us thousands of cash match dollars. Some historic photos and paintings have been hung in the hallway with many more planned for the future. Jerry Lewandowski did his usual masterful job installing the wainscoting and chair rail. We are very proud of this newest project and we think you will be impressed. A new mural will soon be installed in the museum, with a grand opening on Election Day, May 20. We will again be selling our homemade jelly and jam that day.

The Yarns Cider Mill project at the Suraci Farm will be a priority for the rest of the year. Much was accomplished last year with great local support. We hope to keep up the progress this year. When the building is repaired to a safe condition, we plan to host an open house, hopefully this fall, when we will showcase the progress made and the plans for the future.

The Hoover School, Museum of Local History, and the Clifford Baptist Church will again be open to the public, free of charge, the third Sunday each month from 1:00 to 4:00 pm, May through October. An afternoon spent experiencing life as a one-room school student or using the hands-on tools of yesteryear at the museum or appreciating the wonderous features of the Clifford Baptist Church that was built in Thomas Jefferson's lifetime would be a very worthwhile and interesting afternoon for all ages.

Our booth at the Clifford Volunteer Firemen's Picnic will feature several antique machines used by local housewives and farmers. We want everyone, but especially the youngsters, to work these old tools so they can get a real feel of the past!

The current 'little white' church in Dundaff Corners was constructed in the late 1850s and continues as a summer chapel today.
