ORDINANCE NO.1 of 2004

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CLIFFORD, SUSQUEHANNA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REGULATING PUBLIC SAFETY AND PARKING BY REQUIRING THE REMOVAL OF ALL VEHICLES FROM THE TOWNSHIP RIGHT-OF-WAYS DURING PERIODS REQUIRING SNOW REMOVAL

WHEREAS the Township of Clifford wishes to provide for the public safety and the efficient removal of snow from the road of the Township in a timely manner, and

WHEREAS it is necessary for the removal of all vehicles parked in the right-of-ways of the Township roads during the periods when snow removal is required,

IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Township Supervisors in and for the Township of Clifford, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1.

Any vehicle parked, stalled or incapable of moving under its own power or left unattended in any Township road right-of-way may be removed or towed away to any other location by the Police Department of the Township of Clifford or by persons authorized by the Police Department to do so. The cost of removal and towing of any such vehicle shall be assessed by the Township against the registered owner thereof, and if the registered owner fails to pay the cost of towing and removal, the Township shall file a municipal lien under the Municipal Lien Act of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 2.

Any registered owner of a motor vehicle who violates the provisions of this Ordinance is guilty of a summary offence as defined under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure and shall, upon conviction before a District Justice, pay a fine of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), together with costs of prosecution, and in default of payment, undergo imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days.

Section 3.

This Ordinance shall take effect on the fifth (5th) day after enactment.
